- **5. PLANNING BOARD** PB discussed the Natural Resources chapter of the Master Plan, particularly regarding the importance of water quality. Also discussed were flood risks and future risks of forest fires with so many dying trees and drought. The Board had a work session on July 22 focused on short-term rentals.
- **6. FOSS MANAGEMENT** Emily Lucy, with the help of Dick Fortin and family members, was successful in harvesting over 1,000 pints of blueberries in her first year. She will get additional help next year to increase yield even more.

Olivia Saunders will test soil at Brooks Pasture. Also, tree and shrub growth moving across the stone wall needs to be cut in October after hornets calm down.

**7. TOWN LAND MANAGEMENT** – Paul will attend the PB monthly meeting to discuss ECC input to the proposed Wetland overlay district ordinance.

GMCG tested Thurston Pond with a dissolved oxygen probe – results were normal. Crystal Lake Ecoli reading was high but within the permitted limits for swimming. ECC will start recording temperatures at the lake.

Conway Lake water quality report was presented at the annual CLCA meeting – Conway Lake remains pristine.

The wooden water bar on Willis Bean Road was removed by someone. The water bar may need to be rebuilt. Dick and Paul will assess in Sept/Oct.
